



Culverhill School

Evidencing the Impact of the Primary PE and Sport Premium 2019/20

Culverhill School received £16,330 funding for the 2019/20 academic year.

The DfE have announced an in-year variation to the Terms and Conditions of the grant for 2019/20 which can be viewed [here](#). It states that due to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic:

“the premium does not have to be completely spent by schools in the academic year beginning 1 September 2019, some or all of it may be carried forward into the academic year beginning 1 September 2020 but must be spent by 31 March 2021.”

A total of £525 was spent in 2019/20 for Golf and Archery tuition the impact of which was to provide a broader experience and range of sports to pupils.

Therefore £15,805 of the grant was unspent and has been carried forward to 2020/21.

The funding, together with the grant received for 2020/21 will be spent in accordance with the grant terms and conditions on one or more of the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school pupils undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school
2. The profile of Physical Education, School Sport and Physical Activity (PESSPA) being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.
